The University of Vienna is the controller, i.e. the entity responsible for this processing activity, in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). For the purpose of this processing activity, the University of Vienna processes the following categories of personal data:

Legal foundations of the processing activity:

- consent from the data subject
- performance of a task carried out by the University of Vienna in the public interest
- overriding legitimate interests of the University of Vienna, i.e. ensuring adherence to the principles of research ethics.

The University of Vienna may not be able to comply with its obligations to you if you do not provide your personal data. This applies if the provision of personal data is a statutory or contractual requirement, or a requirement necessary to enter into a contract.

If the University does not collect the data from you personally, it obtains them from publicly accessible sources.

Your personal data will be disclosed to the following recipients outside the University of Vienna, who are all members of the Ethics Committee of the University of Vienna:

Your personal data will not be transferred to recipients in a third country (EU or EEA country) or an international organisation.

The University of Vienna will store your personal data for a duration of 30 years.

As a data subject of this processing activity you have the following rights:

- right to access to personal data,
- right to rectification of personal data,
- right to erasure of personal data,
- right to restriction of processing,
- right to data portability and
- right to object to the further processing of your personal data, if the controller processes your data based on overriding legitimate interests or if the processing is necessary for academic or historical research purposes or statistical purposes.

In addition, you have the right to withdraw your consent to the processing of your personal data at any time without having to state a reason. Finally, you also have the possibility to lodge a complaint with the Austrian Data Protection Authority ([www.dsb.gv.at](http://www.dsb.gv.at)) if you believe that the processing of your personal data is not permissible.
